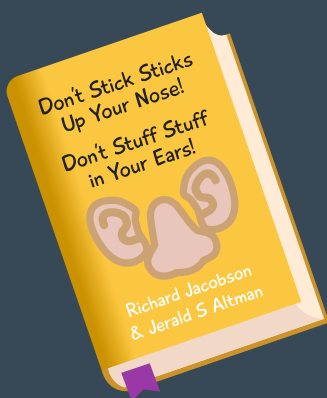
PREVENTION FOR CHILDREN



Avoid small objects or batteries near young children.



Seek urgent medical attention if you are worried your child has put something into their ear, nose or throat.

PREVENTION FOR ADULTS



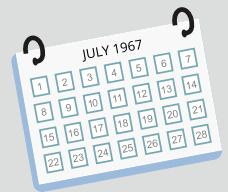
Never put cotton buds inside the ear canal.



Try to avoid using silicone based ear plugs.



Be extra careful when handling hearing aids. Ensure the eartips are fitted on correctly before use.



Change ear plugs regularly.
